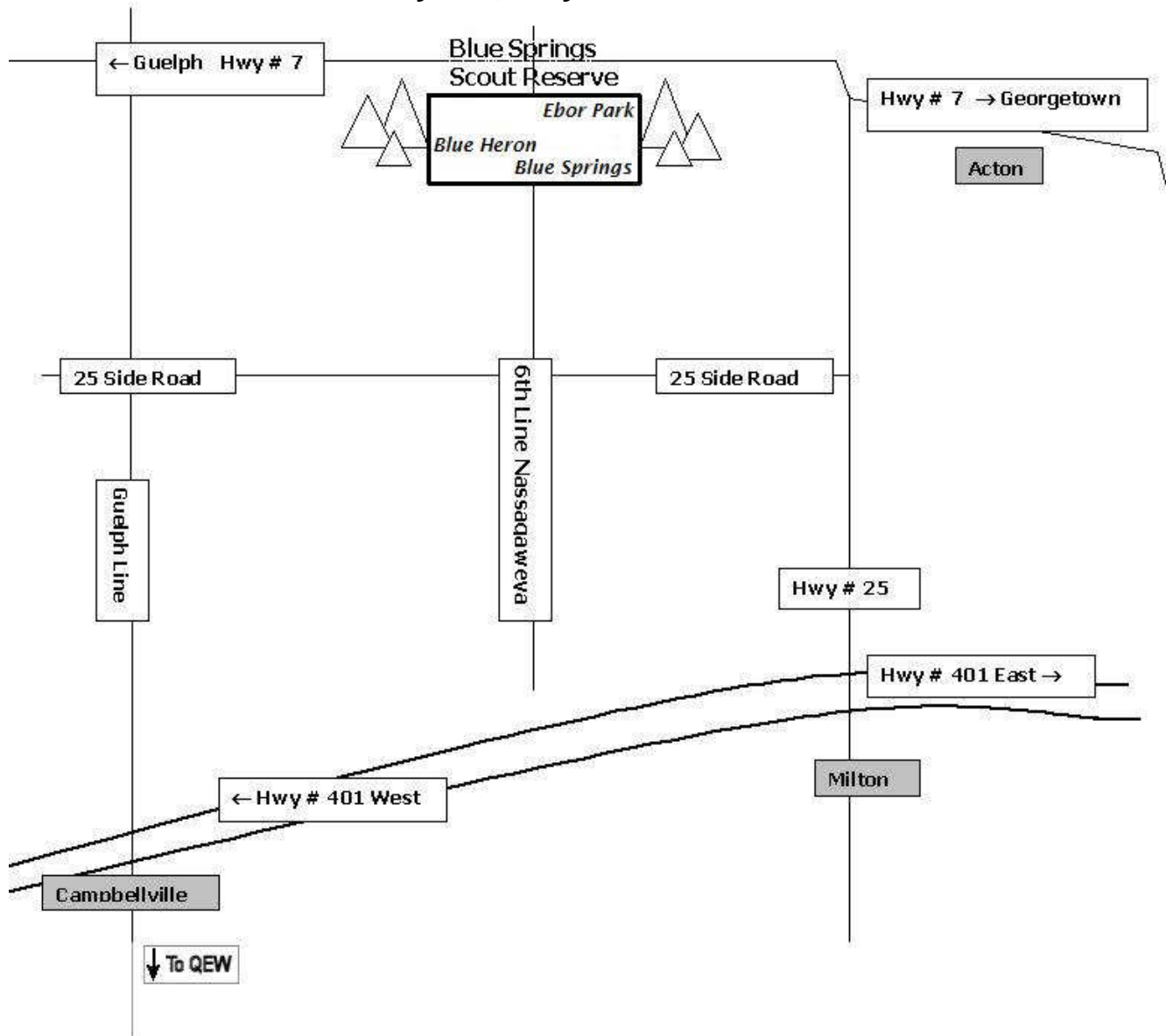

GENERAL INFORMATION

This booklet introduces you and your group to the program for the 1st Wellington All Sections Camp. The weekend is planned around basic section program skills. We hope your youth will take an active part in everything offered and will take home some great memories.

THE LAW OF THE CAMP IS THE SCOUT LAW.

In order to make the camp as enjoyable as possible for all participants the following information is necessary.

- UNIFORM** Full uniform is to be worn at the following times:
Arrival, Flag Break, Scout's Own, Closing and Departure
- ARRIVAL** Gate opens at 10:00 a.m. Friday, May 22, 2009. A Section representative is to inform **CAMP PLACEMENT** of your arrival to obtain your campsite. Those **NOT PREREGISTERED** will be assigned a site on an availability basis. Set up your campsite ASAP. You may drop your equipment trailer on Thursday night between 6 and 8pm. We will not be responsible for your equipment if you do so.
- EQUIPMENT** At camp follow directions of the parking and security crew. They will get you in quickly. We do suggest you pack all group gear in one or two vehicles. They will be directed to the drop off area. Personal gear will be carried from the parking area. Staff will move Troop trailers onto sites.
- DEPARTURE** Before you move a vehicle, your gear must be packed and your site inspected to receive a departure clearance. The Group Commissioner is the Sub-Camp Chief at your site and upon site inspection, will give out your crests. Please cooperate with our staff. They are doing their job to move you as fast as they can. We hope this camp will be one you will remember for a long time.
- COOKING** Cooking will be on stoves or barbecues. There are to be no open fires on sites.
- GARBAGE** All garbage is to be taken out with you upon departure from camp. Garbage bags are available from Headquarters.
- FIRST AID** A First Aid Station will be on site for the weekend. All sections should be prepared for minor cuts and bruises. **All accidents MUST be reported to the First Aid Station.**
- WATER** Drinking water can be drawn from the outside taps. **Do not wash dishes at the taps.**

TREES There will be no cutting or hacking trees in any way. There will be no gathering of firewood! Be careful of any small plantings around camp. This is a scouting area so please respect it. Remember to be wise in the use of your resources.

MUSIC There will be no radios, tape players, etc. on Scout sites. Walkie Talkies are restricted to Camp Personnel only.

DUTY TO GOD Sections are expected to have a blessing before meals. **Scouts Own will be held on Sunday morning at camp and all participants are expected to attend.**

SPIRITS The only spirit is the **Scout Spirit.**

STAFF WASHROOMS Staff washrooms are off limits to all youth members. Kybos marked LADIES are for the use of females only.

WEAPONS AND FIREWORKS Weapons of any kind and fireworks are not allowed in camp. Anyone found with either in their possession will be asked to leave camp immediately with their group.

EMERGENCY VEHICLES **EMERGENCY VEHICLES MUST BE GIVEN THE RIGHT OF WAY IMMEDIATELY**, this includes the Camp Vehicles (gators).

FIRE LANES AND ROADWAY Fire lanes and roadways must remain open at all times. Tents, gateways, guy ropes, etc. **MUST** be kept out of fire lanes.

*****TUCK SHOP***** There will be a tuck shop on site selling pop and some candy. It will be closed during meals. There will be some Scouting articles available at the Tuck Shop.***

NO PETS ALLOWED WITH THE ONLY EXCEPTION BEING SERVICE DOGS

LEADERS: Please ensure you provide an emergency cell-phone contact number with information sent home with the youth.

THESE GUIDELINES ARE TO ENSURE THAT EVERYONE WILL HAVE FUN!!!!

LEADER INFORMATION

- ACTIVITIES** Each group section is to bring one activity for their own section, to be enjoyed by all groups. Please ensure you have enough people to run your activity.
- SCHEDULE** The attached schedule is for everyone's guidance. We will follow the times as closely as possible. You and your youth can help by following the schedule also. Stress to the youth the need for a good nights sleep both nights. Please post the schedule and provide it to your youth.
- OFF LIMITS** Staff area and kitchen are also off limits. **All areas past the Obstacle Course are off limits. Check with Camp Staff for boundaries. No-one may cross the 6th Line road.**
- REGISTRATION** The registration form attached to this booklet is to be returned no later than May 1, 2009. Cost is \$ 16.00 per person except for Venturers. *****Venturer camp cost is \$21.00 per person due to DJ cost for the dance***** Campsites will be allocated as registrations are received. Each Section Leader is required to bring an up-to-date Medical Form, which is the registration form filled in for each youth. The medical forms will be retained by the Section Leader during the camp.
- SLEEPING/SITE** Leaders will sleep on site, in separate tents, near the youth. **LEADER TENTS** must be identified. Groups will identify their sites. There is extremely limited electricity available.
- CAMPFIRE** All participants are expected to participate in Campfire on Saturday night. Please inform your youth of proper campfire etiquette. Group campfires are NOT permitted.
- KYBOS** Leaders are asked to help the camp staff to keep the kybos clean. Instruct your youth on the necessity of this and if you observe any problems please report them to the HQ area.
- PICNIC TABLES** We will try to provide one picnic table per site, as available. Be prepared not to have one.

THERE WILL BE NO SPORTS IN THE SUB CAMP AREA, the adjacent areas may be used, **AND NO FOOTBALL IN CAMP ANYWHERE.**
